#### SCHOOL OF ECONOMICS APPROVED

The School will consist of two divisions — the existing Institute of Economic Development and Research, and the Department of Economics. Appointed Officer-In-Charge of the new School was Dr. Amado Castro. The School will commence operations after the second semester.
